# FIELD REP TRAINING


Training with one or more of the supervisors

- Spend a week with MSRO's

# MILK PICK UP ON FARMS

- Issues over the past year
  - Letters sent out to all licensed bulk milk weigher samplers
-

# OVER FILLING OF BULK TANKS

- What is the capacity of a bulk tank?
  - Do not add numbers to the conversion chart
  - Agitation for a representative sample
-

# PARTIAL PICK UP IS PERMITTED IF

1. The bulk tank is equipped with a 7 day recording device approved by the department
2. The bulk tank is cleaned and sanitized when emptied.
3. The bulk tank is emptied at least every 72 hours.
4. The bulk milk weigher and sampler indicates the time and date on the recorder chart when a partial pickup is made and when the bulk tank is emptied

# TANKER ROLL OVER

- Details of the incident
- Who is the driver and trucking company w/contact info
- Where was the milk destined to be received
- Where did the milk come from
- Is there damage to the interior of the Bulk Milk Tanker
- Can it be pumped into another tanker in a sanitary manner
- What will be the disposition of the milk

# TANKER ROLLER OVER CONTINUED

- Contact Sanitarian or Supervisor during normal business hours
- All incidences will be handled by the Emergency Response Coordinator
- All incidences shall be reported

# BULK MILK WEIGHER SAMPLER PROJECT

- Pilot project in 2017
  - BMWS was implemented in 2018
-
